Midwife Certification for Prescribing and Insertion of Intrauterine Contraception

Activity Log

Midwives with specialized training in prescriptive contraceptive therapeutics who are certified by the College of Midwives of BC (CMBC) may prescribe hormonal and intrauterine contraceptives for women in the three months following childbirth¹.

Evidence-based continuing education programs are a necessary component for updating practitioners' knowledge². Certified prescribers are expected to keep up to date with the latest evidence relevant to IUCs. If a midwife has not been actively inserting IUCs over the preceding 24 months, completion of an approved continuing education module may be required for recertification.
