

POLICY ON CONTINUING COMPETENCY IN CARDIOPULMONARY RESUSCITATION

The midwife will be certified every two years in cardiopulmonary resuscitation. The minimum required standard of performance is the designated program of the Heart and Stroke Foundation of Canada, Basic Life Support – BLS Provider (formerly known as Basic Life Support for Healthcare Providers (BLS for HCP) which covers the following core areas for CPR and emergency cardiac care:

- adult cardiopulmonary resuscitation
- pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation
- two-rescuer scenarios
- use of bag valve mask
- management of foreign-body airway obstruction
- use of Automated External Defibrillator (AED)

Acceptable certification courses include:

All courses offered must be delivered by certified instructors and must be delivered at a level equivalent to the Heart & Stoke Foundation Basic Life Support – BLS Provider standards & guidelines.

Midwives wishing to take any other courses not listed above to meet this requirement must seek pre-approval from CMBC.
